

SAFARI EQUIPMENT CHECKLIST

CLOTHING:

- 2 Hats or Ball Caps
- Wool Watch Cap
- Warm Jacket (Green, Tan, Camo)
- Polyfleece Vest (Green, Tan, Camo)
- Sweater (Green, Tan, Camo)
- Bush Jacket (Green, Tan, Camo)
- 2 Long Sleeve Bush Shirts (Green, Tan)
- 3 Short Sleeve Bush Shirts (Green, Tan) – Travel in One of These
- 2 Long Pants (Green, Tan, Camo) – Travel in One Pair
- 3 Bush Shorts
- 6 Pair of Hunting Socks
- 2 Pair of Lighter Socks (travel and for evenings)
- 2 Pair of Hunting Boots - Travel in One Pair
- Gloves
- 6 Pair of Under shorts
- 3 T-shirts
- 1 set Poly-Pro Long Underwear (To Wear In Blinds)
- 1 Pair of Sandals or Camp Shoes
- Handkerchiefs
- 1 Sweatshirt / Sweatpants (Wear Around Fire in Evenings)
- 2 Heavy Duty Belts (1 for Pants & 1 for Ammo Pouches, Knife, Etc)
- 1 Stowaway Rain Suit (Optional)
- 1 Bug Tamer Suit – Pants & Jacket (Optional)
- 1 Set of Lightly Insulated Camo Overalls (Good for Wear in Open Safari Car at Daylight and Dark, as well as in the Blinds)

PERSONAL ITEMS:

Prescription Medicines:

- Anti-Diarrhea Medicine
- Anti-Nausea Medicine
- Heavy Duty Pain Killer (Tylox, Hydrocodone, Etc)
- Heavy Duty Antibiotic (Cipro, Etc)
- Prednisone Tablets (For Major Allergic Reaction)
- Anti-Allergy Medicine (If Needed)
- Insect Bite Medicine (If Needed)
- Anti-Malarial Medicine (We recommend Malarone)
- Complete Supply of Personal Prescriptions You May Take Daily

Over-the-Counter Medicines:

- Toothbrush (2)
- Toothpaste
- Comb / Hairbrush
- Razor and Blades
- Shaving Cream

Over-the-Counter Medicines (cont'd):

- Deodorant
- Antibiotic Cream
- Moisturizing Cream
- Shampoo
- Dentemp (Temporary Filling)
- Orajel (Gum / Tooth Pain)
- Motrin, Tylenol, Etc
- Vicks, Nyquil, Etc (Cough / Cold)
- Throat Lozenges (Sore Throat or for Blind Sitting)
- Band-aids
- Handi-Wipes (Anti-septic Wipes)
- Blister Covers
- Bactine Antiseptic Spray
- Chap stick
- Tums, Maalox, Etc
- Gas-X, Etc (Intestinal Gas)
- Sunscreen (SPF 30 or Higher)
- 2 Pairs of Eyeglasses (If You Use Them)

SHOOTING EQUIPMENT:

- 2 Pair of Earplugs or Hearing Protection
- Insect Repellant
- Binoculars
- 2 Cartridge Pouches for Each Rifle (One for Solids, One for Softs)
- 1 Small Cleaning Kit for Rifles
- Lens Cleaning Kit for Scopes and Binoculars
- 2 Pair of Polarized Sunglasses
- Camera(s) with Extra Batteries and memory cards
- CD/Disk (optional) to burn PH's photos onto disk before leaving camp
- 1 Bag of Plastic Zip Ties (10"-12" size)
- Extra Batteries for Illuminated Scopes
- Pocket Knife or Multi-Tool
- Hunting Knife
- Sharpening Steel or Stone

RIFLES:

Bring the rifles of your choice. Be sure to bring about 40 rounds of solids for your heavy rifle. I usually bring 40 rounds of both solids and premium soft-points for both of my rifles. If you are bringing a second plains game rifle bring 40 rounds of premium soft-points. Most PH's will have shotguns for birdshooting. You will be billed at our cost by the box for any shotgun ammunition that you use to shoot birds while on safari.

CARRY ON BAG:

USE A BACKPACK OR SOMETHING THAT CAN RIDE IN THE BACK OF THE OPEN SAFARI CAR

- Health Card (If you have one)
- Cash
- Blank Checks
- Travelers Checks
- 2 Major Credit Cards – AMEX can be used in SA, but not so much in Zimbabwe
- Med Jet Card
- Global Rescue Card
- Medical Insurance Card
- Frequent Flyer Card (If you have one)
- US Customs Form 4457 (For Re-Entry into U.S. with your Rifles)
- Emergency Phone Numbers List
- Business Cards
- Game Tags for your Trophies
- Pack in your Carry On Bag All of the Following (In Addition to the Above Paperwork):
 - Change of Underwear, Hunting Shirt, Hunting Pants or Shorts, Hunting Socks, Binoculars, Camera, Earplugs, Personal Shaving Kit, and One Set of your Daily Prescription Medicines (in case your luggage is lost for a day).*
